Two Universities Recognized for Accomplishments

During the conference luncheon on Monday, Diane Baca, Chair of the Region's Awards Committee, presented the Region's award for the past year. First to be recognized was **Duke University and Health System**: Accepting the **Southern Region Quality in Human Resource Practice Award** was **Linda Hendricks**, Assistant Vice President of Talent Management, and **Sally Allison**, Manager of the Professional Development Institute.

Duke University and Florida International University are recognized for quality and excellence in HR

Duke was recognized for its 40-week staff development program which uses professional development to improve staff skills and talents thus strengthening workforce commitment, improving retention, and supporting the university's commitment to diversity by enhancing the percentage of women and minorities in higher-level positions. This program of the Professional Development Institute has a 96% graduation rate, and 75% of the participants from the Institute's first classes of the office staff development program are now in higher-level position at Duke.

Diane then presented the Region's **Excellence in Human Resource Management Award** to **Florida International University**. Accepting the award on behalf of the university was **Paul Michaud**, Assistant VP for Human Resources; **Iliana Ricelli**, Senior Director for Employee/Labor Relations/Workforce Recruitment; and **Jose Capote**, Senior Recruiter.

Florida International's committed HR team was recognized for its innovations over the last two years which have dramatically improved the institution: The initiatives include same-sex health stipends for faculty and staff, an HR Dashboard, a catastrophic leave pool, educational incentive awards, professional development leave with pay for non-faculty staff, a Leadership Academy, an on-line applicant tracking system, improved compensation processes, a new performance management process, and a work-life balance program with flex time and compressed work weeks.

Maria Martinez Honored with Distinguished Service Award

The awards portion of the program would not have been complete without the last individual award presented by Awards Committee Chair Diane Baca: Outgoing Chair **Maria Martinez received the Southern Region Distinguished Service Award.**

Maria, Assistant Vice President of Human Resources and Risk Management at Rollins College, has worked effectively and tirelessly for the Region since 1998. On the Regional level, Maria has held several Director-at-Large roles and the Secretary-Treasurer, Chair-Elect, and Chair positions. On the National level, she served

on the National Board of CUPA-HR and was a key member of the Knowledge Center Committee.

Because of her take charge style and organizational and HR savvy, Maria has improved the Region's committee structure and expanded the role and influence of state chapters. She has presided over one of the most successful Regional Conferences in recent history and dedicated herself to improving the Region's ability to assist members with HR improvement. Tom Hoffacker

The Southern Region Board welcomes a new Director-at-Large, Tom Hoffacker, the Director of Human Resources at Coastal Georgia Community College (CGCC) in Brunswick, Georgia.

Coastal Georgia is a part of the University System of Georgia offering two-year associate degree programs to prepare students to transfer to senior colleges and universities; one- and two-year career programs to prepare students for immediate employment and development; and courses for students who need to refresh or strengthen their academic skills. As Brunswick Junior College, CGCC was founded in 1961 by the Regents of the University System of Georgia. After several expansion of its role and size, Brunswick College was renamed Coastal Georgia Community College in 1995 to better reflect the mission of the institution. In its forty-fourth year of existence, CGCC provides higher education opportunities from two campuses to the residents of southeast Georgia.

In only his second year at the college, Tom Hoffacker provides human resources support for 170 staff and faculty. With previous work experience with the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta and as the managing director at a neurosurgery practice in Brunswick, Tom is now responsible for human resources, affirmative action, and ethics at CGCC. He is a member of the institution's President's Cabinet as well as President-Elect of the University System of Georgia's HR Association, and a member of the University System's HR Policy-Making Board

Tom became interested in CUPA-HR activities because his predecessor as HR director had been active in CUPA-HR, and Tom says he "needed to learn quickly about HR in higher education.... I told several people that I was so impressed with CUPA-HR that I wanted to get involved."

Tom has both a BS in Management and an MS in Human Resources from Purdue University, and he and his wife Jennifer have three children: Laura 13, Mary 10, and Dennie 5. Tom is a deacon in his church, a member of the Board of Directors of the local Habitat for Humanity affiliate, and a member of a local education committee. He enjoys biking or running in the mornings with his dog, and plays golf whenever he has the time.
